1. Chairmans Report

JP is happy to report of another successful year for the club, with excellent attendance across all club rides and activities. Our Saturday ride now encompasses 2 or even 3 groups due to numbers, with double digit attendance even through Winter weather.

The additional midweek and Sunday rides also see good attendance.

Appreciation was extended to Duncan and all the members who take on group leader roles. The chair states that expanding the clubs roster of qualified ride leaders would be a priority given the consistent numbers that the club rides are enjoying.

2. Open Events

Summer CycloCross: A lower overall number of entrants at our Rozzelle Summer race meant that the event made a small loss. Providing a SDS (Sport Disability Scotland) category again was greatly appreciated by Tom A'Hara and the SDS team. It was also good to see some Burners giving cyclocross a shot for the first time.

JP believes that embarking on another Summer CX event would have to be considered very carefully.

Pedal Ayr: Another excellent family event that The Burners played a pivotal role in helping to deliver. Roughly 500 participants enjoyed traffic free roads around a 10k loop, with the Low Green providing a big event atmosphere for all those who took part. There has been no indication as to another Pedal Ayr running in 2023/24.

Ayrshire Alps Sportive: The Rotary Club of Ayr organized the AA Sportive in October, with all proceeds going to the Malawi appeal. Over 100 riders took part, with The Burners happy to provide equipment support to the event.

DoonBank Trofee #9: The 9th edition of the DBT proved successful despite the drop in post Covid attendance, which has been a common factor with many grassroots/volunteer driven events. The event broke even, but only just. A loss would have been made if a last minute donation from the Community Sports Hub wasn't secured. This donation was used to pay our fees for the hire of the Pavilion.

The Burners again provided a category for SDS athletes as well as 'Taster' categories which enables novice riders to enjoy the event without the pressure of racing. JP thanked everyone who was involved in delivering the event, with positive feedback from all the riders who visited Rozzelle.

The negative aspect to the event centered around parking complaints from local residents. Parking at Rozzelle has always been limited, with entrants utilizing the streets around the event for carparking. Unfortunately some bad parking saw residents being blocked which led to official complaints being lodged. The organizing team have looked at alternative venues, with some positive progress made at Kyle Academy. This new venue would provide some excellent legacy potential through pupil involvement.
